CAP CADET PROGRAM

This manual supplement prescribes additional procedures in effect for all Wisconsin Wing CAP units. Full understanding of this supplement may only be obtained by reading it in conjunction with the related paragraphs of CAPR 52-16.

CAPR 52-16, December 1998 is supplemented as follows:

7-3. Composition:

d. Added. The echelons authorized representation in the Wisconsin Wing CAC are cadet and composite squadrons and flights (see paragraph 7-3.a. above). The representative from each unit will be the cadet commander (primary appointee) or alternate and will be appointed by the squadron commander on CAP Form 2a.

7-10. CAC Operating Instruction. Added. Operating procedures for the Cadet Advisory Council are contained in Wing Operating Instruction 52-16.

11-9. Accounting for Use of Funds. Units will compile orientation flights on CAP Form 7 and mail one copy to Wing Headquarters/WICP. WICP will verify cadet eligibility for each flight, sign the CAPF 7, and forward them to the Wing Liaison Office in Madison.

9-16. Drug Demand Reduction Training (DDRT):

a. Purpose. The purpose of DDRT is to increase knowledge of and develop positive attitudes towards drug education. Teens listen to teens. With this in mind, DDRT gives cadets the necessary knowledge to promote drug-free lifestyles to their fellow cadets as well as their community.

b. General Information. DDRT is a one-day course which can be convened within the wing/region at any time.

(1) The site is determined by the needs of the wing/region and/or by WICP.

(2) Funding is supported by National HQ DDR grants.

c. Objectives. At the conclusion of DDRT, the cadet participants:

(1) Increase their knowledge of drugs and the effects of abuse.

(2) Improve their public speaking skills.

(3) Understand the philosophy behind anti-legalization of drugs.

(4) Are able to promote drug-free attitudes to others.

(5) Understand the principles of public speaking and how to relate to different types of audiences.

d. Requirements. To earn the DDRT shoulder cord, cadets must:

(1) Attend one DDRT session.

(2) Give at least two speeches to their squadrons, schools, or community organizations. No more than one of these presentations may be given to the member's squadron.

(3) Forward a copy of CAP Form 2a with written acknowledgment of the presentations from the receiving organizations to the unit commander. The unit commander will approve the Form 2a and forward to WICP.

e. Awards. Upon approval of CAP Form 2a, the cadet is eligible to wear a purple shoulder cord, denoting participation in this special activity.
