

2026 Wisconsin Wing Conference

Rules of Engagement

1. Mandatory "quiet hours" require that cadets be in their assigned hotel room and quiet. Room doors will be shut, and no cadets of opposite genders will be present in a room. Roaming the halls, making loud noises (that can be heard beyond the room), or other disruptive activities are prohibited.
 - a. Friday: 2300 hours, Saturday: 2300 hours
 - b. Quiet hour concerns will be referred to the cadets' chaperone(s) for resolution.
 - c. Chaperones are expected to ensure cadets are in their assigned rooms at the appointed time.
2. There will be **mandatory** cadet meetings (IAW CAPR 60-2):
 - a. Friday evening at 2000 hours at the Cadet Social if arriving after 2000 cadet or cadet chaperon must check in with LtCol Joshua Risler
 - b. 0745 hours on Saturday morning, before the General Assembly outside the General Assembly room.
 - c. Immediately following the banquet in the ballroom.
 - d. 0845 hours on Sunday outside the room where breakfast is served.
 - e. Cadets not at the mandatory meeting will have to be located, and their squadron commander/chaperone will be notified. Once located, they will not be released to anyone except their chaperone or squadron commander.
3. Cadets must move around **the hotel** in groups of three. This does not apply to areas where the conference is actively taking place, which is defined as the breakout rooms/meeting rooms/assembly rooms and/or when moving between those rooms. Another way to think about this is, if you are moving from or to your hotel room or the water park, you must be in a group of three.
4. Cadets staying at a different hotel may not return to their hotel unless they are accompanied by a chaperone. They must travel in groups of three (including the senior).
5. The primary goal of the Wing Conference is to learn new skills and information. Cadets will attend breakout sessions until at least 1530 hours. **All cadets must attend the Cadet General Assembly.**
 - a. Cadets should make a schedule of breakout sessions they intend to attend.
 - b. Cadets can attend cadet or senior breakout sessions they are interested in, unless specified as senior only.
 - c. Cadets found skipping breakout sessions or cadets at the hotel without conference registration will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination.
6. Cadets staying at the conference hotel may not leave the hotel unless accompanied by a chaperone. They must travel in groups of three (including the senior). Cadets may return to their room to get something, change a uniform item, etc, if the cadet complies with the three-person movement requirement and the breakout session attendance requirement.
7. Cadets should refer to the UOD and packing list to ensure they have the proper uniform for conference events.
 - a. ABU's should not be worn at any time during the conference.
 - b. Due to the professional nature of this event and the presence of several partner agencies, civilian attire should be conservative. This includes swimwear, swimsuit coverups and, for females, formal attire.
 - c. When not in uniform, cadets must always carry, or have readily accessible, their conference credentials.
8. Any time a member of the opposite gender is present the door to a room must be open.
9. Senior chaperones must be available and in a condition to address cadet issues at all times. If a senior wishes to "transfer chaperoning duties" to another senior, then that senior must be from the original senior's squadron. The chaperoned cadets must also be notified.
10. **Senior Chaperones will be responsible for collecting and storing their cadets' medication, both prescription and OTC, as well as vitamins, supplements, etc. Chaperones will also log when they administer cadets' medication on paper.**
11. **Cadets will voluntarily turn in their medication to their appointed senior member chaperone.**
12. Cadets may use the pool during the following times:
 - a. Friday evening until it closes or 2230 whichever is sooner
 - b. Saturday from 1545-1730 hours. The banquet begins at 1800 hours, and all cadets are expected to attend the banquet.
 - c. Saturday after the banquet **until mandatory quiet time.**
 - d. Sunday morning.
